J B College (Autonomous): Glorious Past and Promising Future

Jagannath Barooah College, since its inception in the year 1930, has been striving ahead for academic excellence in the field of higher education. As one of the premier institutes of Higher Education in the North East, Jagannath Barooah College added another milestone in its journey of 88 years by bagging the 64th rank in the all India rankings released by National Institutional Ranking Framework(NIRF)by the Ministry of Human Development in April 2017. It may be added that this institution is the only one in the entire North East to be ranked amongst the first hundred colleges in India. Reaccredited by NAAC with 'A' grade in the year 2011 and awarded Star College status by DBT with effect from 2016-17 the institution was conferred autonomous status on 13th Oct 2015 and the first batch of students under CBCS(Choice Based Credit System) has already been admitted in the 2016-17 session. The institution has signed MOUs(memorandum of Understanding) with five different organisations to help further the cause of higher education. The organizations are OKD (Omiyo Kumar Das Institute of Social Science), IIE (Indian Institution of Entrepreneurship), Department of Commerce, Dibrugarh University, North Eastern Small Scale Industries Association, Jorhat and NIE LIT, Ministry of Communication. Proud of its glorious past, confident of its present and hopeful of its future J B College marches on in its search for academic excellence.

Behind the establishment of this premier seat of higher education lies the selfless and enthusiastic commitment of a small but highly learned group of scholars of this culturally rich city who, in fact, shaped the destiny of the academic milieu of the North East region in general and the entire Brahmaputra valley in particular. The valuable contributions made by this dedicated group subsequently led to the formal initiation of an institution known as **Upper Assam College** in Jorhat in 19th August, 1930. Less than a month later, i.e., on 4th September 1930, the first Governing Body (GB) Meeting of the Upper Assam College resolved to name the college as **Jorhat College** and this continued till 1938 when, in a resolution of another GB Meeting, it was again decided to rename the college as **Jagannath**

Barooah College. The founder Principal of this oldest institution of the region was Prof. Krishna Kanta Handiqui, world renowned Orientalist, distinguished scholar and academician. The other dedicated founder teachers were Prof. Tulsi Narayan Sarma (Founder Secretary), Jagneswar Sarma, Phanidhar Dutta, Prafulla Pran Changkakati and Gunagobinda Dutta. With a small batch of 14 students in 1930, the college began its journey with Intermediate of Arts (IA) which received formal affiliation from Calcutta University in 1931. Thereafter, the progress of the college was rapid. In 1939, the Intermediate of Commerce (I.Com.), in 1941 the Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) in 1944 the Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com), in 1949-50 the Intermediate of Science I.Sc.) and in 1952-53 the Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) streams were opened. From 1931 to 1948, the college was affiliated to Calcutta University and from 1948 to 1965 to Gauhati University. Since the establishment of Dibrugarh University (DU) in 1965, the college has been affiliated to it. The college now has a diversified field of teaching. Currently it has 20 departments, viz., Assamese, Bengali, Biotechnology, Botany, Chemistry, Commerce, Computer Science, Economics, English, Geography, Geology, Hindi, History, Mathematics, Philosophy, Physics and Electronics, Political Science, Sanskrit, Statistics and Zoology. Since 2013 J.B. College has been imparting Major programmes only. Except Bengali, Biotechnology and Computer Science, all other subjects have Major Courses at the Degree level. Since its inception, J.B. College has always engaged itself in its search of academic excellence with the motto "Na, hi Jnanena Sadrisam Pavitramiha Vidyate' i.e. 'there is nothing holier than knowledge'.

Regular Post-Graduate (PG) courses in Geography and Philosophy have been functioning since 1995 and 1996 respectively and PG courses in Assamese, Commerce and Political Science have started functioning since 2016. Besides under the Distance Education Scheme of Dibrugarh University, there are PG Courses in Assamese, Commerce, Economics, Mathematics, Political Science and Sociology. There is also a center of K.K. Handique State Open University that offers different UG and PG Courses. Equipped with tools like "College with Potential for Excellence", Grade 'A' and autonomy the J.B. College fraternity is confident in its mission of providing a conducive environment for the all round development of the community at large and the students in particular.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. A student shall lose his/her right of Admission to his/her class, if he/she fails to attend his/her classes continuously for 15 teaching days from the date of the commencement of classes.
- 2. The courses of study in J. B. College are full time courses. No student can take any other full time course concurrently. If any student is admitted to any other course, then the student/guardian should inform the college authority immediately and discontinue the other course if he/she wants to continue the course at J.B. College. Violation of this provision will lead to disciplinary action.
- 3. If a newly admitted student of HS or TDC First Semester fails to attend classes within 07 (Seven) days from the commencement of classes, he/she will forfeit his/her seat.
- 4. Students are responsible for their conduct to the Principal and are prohibited from doing anything either inside or outside the college, that amounts to breach of discipline or interference in the discipline and normal working of the college. Students shall be liable to disciplinary action for violation of any of the rules of discipline. Disciplinary action may involve warning and/or fine, and/or suspension from classes, from the examination, from the use of the college library or even from the college as such.
- 5. Students shall conduct themselves in decorous manner both towards the members of the staff (Teaching and Administrative) and towards their fellow students. Insubordination, unbecoming language or indecorous

- conduct including teasing, ragging, assaulting others, etc. shall be severely dealt with.
- 5. Students shall maintain perfect silence in the classroom and desist from demonstration or disorderly behaviour. They must not loiter in the corridor or in front of the classroom and must keep as quiet as possible at all times.
- 7. Students shall take proper care of the college property, furniture and premises and they must not spoil or cause any damage to, or tamper with the college property, furniture and fittings. They shall not litter the college campus.
- 8. Students shall leave their bicycles, scooters/motorcycles locked in the shed provided for this purpose. No two-wheelers should be parked in any other part of the college campus.
- 9. No Society can be formed in the college without the permission of the Principal, nor shall any person be invited to address a meeting in the college without the prior permission of the college authority.
- 10. Students shall not bring in to college campus any article deemed by the college authority to have a dangerous and /or disruptive influence on the academic environment. Use of Cell phones is strictly prohibited inside the college campus. Students who fail to switch off their Cell phones inside the class will have to pay a fine of Rs.500/- (Rupees five hundred only). Students found in possession of Cell phones inside the examination hall are liable to be expelled.
- 11. All students will be required to attend classes and other activities held inside the college campus in College UNIFORM.

12. Ragging is strictly banned inside the college premises. Students found to be involved in any form of Ragging will be expelled from the college as per the Supreme Court Order. The newly admitted Students will have to submit duly filled Anti-ragging affidavit on the first day of the commencement of class to the Academice Vice Principal of the concerned stream.

Credit fulfillment Criteria

- 1. Every student admitted in to J.B. College CBCS 1st Semester programme must fulfill the required credit. (As per the J.B. College Autonomous Regulations, 2016) Non fulfillment of the required credit will result in debarrment of a student from appearing in the end semester examination.
- 2. It is mandatory for a student to appear in the Sessional Examination.
- 3. The college authority will notify the details of the required credit and other related measures in the first week of August, 2019.

J.B. College has been conferred the Autonomous Status by the UGC on 13th October, 2015 and the college has implemented the autonomous status from the academic session 2016-17. Moreover, from the academic session 2016-17, CBCS is introduced at the degree level.

Moving Towards a New System: CBCS

Ministry of Human Resource Development (HRD), Govt. of India, has already initiated the process for developing New Education Policy (NEP) in our country to bring out reforms in Indian education system. UGC participates more actively in developing National Education Policy, its execution and promotion of higher education in our country. It has already initiated several steps to bring equity, efficiency and academic excellence in National Higher Education System. The important ones include innovation and improvement in course-curricula, introduction of paradigm shift in learning and teaching pedagogy, examination and education system. Against this backdrop, a new system called CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS), an internationally acknowledged system, is adopted. The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective and skill based courses. The courses can be evaluated following the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marks system. Therefore, it is necessary to introduce uniform grading system in the entire higher education in India. This will benefit the students to move across institutions within India to begin with and across countries. The uniform grading system will also enable potential employers in assessing the performance of the

candidates. In order to bring uniformity in evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed. Already all universities of the country have been making necessary arrangement for introducing CBCS at UG level. JB College, being an autonomous college under DU can make academic plan of its own as per UGC guidelines and accordingly, the college is all set to introduce CBCS from the academic session, i.e., 2016-17. Moreover, a separate regulation for the college incorporating course structure under CBCS, evaluation pattern, etc. has been formulated and presented below for the benefit of all stakeholders.

Advantages of the Choice Based Credit System:

- 1. Shift in focus from the teacher-centric to student-centric education.
- 2. Student may undertake as many credits as they can cope with (without repeating all courses in a given semester if they fail in one/more courses).
- 3. CBCS allows students to choose inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary courses, skill oriented papers (even from other disciplines according to their learning needs, interests and aptitude) and more flexibility for students).
- 4. CBCS makes education broad-based and itt par with global standards. One can take credits by combining unique combinations, for example, Physics with Economics, Microbiology with Chemistry or Environment Science etc.
- 5. CBCS offers flexibility for students to study at different times and at different institutions tocomplete one course (ease mobility of students). **Credits earned at one institution can be transferred.**

REGULATIONS FOR THE B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. PROGRAMMES UNDER CBCS, 2016

Short Title, Definitions and Commencement:

These regulations shall be called the J.B. College (Autonomous) Regulations for the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Programmes in the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). These Regulations shall be effective for the Course of Study for the degree of Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) and Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com) programmes, which shall be of three years duration distributed over six semesters.

The Regulations shall come into effect from the Under Graduate Academic Session, 2016-2017.

Definitions:

- (a) College: The term College shall be used to mean J.B. College (Autonomous) imparting B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Programmes affiliated to/permitted by Dibrugarh University.
- **(b) Department:** The term Department shall be used to mean a department of the college with reference to a subject of under graduate study and designated as such by the College.
- **(c) Centre:** The term centre shall be used to mean a centre of the college with reference to a wider field of knowledge to undertake undergraduate Generic Elective and skill enhancement course.
- **(d) Programme:** The term programme is used to mean the whole learning experience or combination of courses in a particular field of study.
- **(e) Course:** Programme is divided into a number of courses. A course may be considered as a paper in conventional educatin system.

- (f) Academic Year: An academic year means a period of twelve months consisting of two semesters.
- **Semester:** The word "semester" is used to mean a half-yearly programme or term of studies consisting of 15 weeks.
- **In-semester:** The word "in-semester" is used to (h) refer to the continuous studies and evaluations within the half-yearly programme.
- **End-semester:** The word "end-semester" is used to (i) refer to the terminal processes of examinations and evaluations at the end of but within the half-yearly programme.
- **Semester Classifications:** (i)

1st, 3rd & 5th Semesters -Odd Semesters:

July 01 - Decvember 20

2nd, 4th & 6th Semesters -Even Semester

December 21 - June 30

- **Teacher:** An Assistant Professor/Associate Professor/ Professor of a college shall be called a teacher. He/She shall be associated with the following functions:
 - (i) Orienting the students about the programmes;
 - Offering the prescribed courses as per the (ii) academic calendar and college routine;
 - Maintaining attendance/performance records (iii) of all students pursuing the course(s).
 - Conducting all in-semester examinations/ (iv) assessments/evaluations;
 - Participating in all examination related (v) process of the college whenever asked for;
 - Cooperating in all activities of the college (vi) meant for better academic pursuit.

Credits: Credit defines the quantum of contents/ syllabus prescribed for a course and determines the number of hours of instruction required per week. Thus, normally in each of the course, credits will be assigned on the basis of the number of lectures/tutorials/laboratory work and other forms of learning required to complete the course contents in 18 week schedule:

> (i) 1 Lecture per week = 1 hour duration per week

> > = 1 Credit

1 Tutorial per week = 1 hour duration per (ii) week

= 1 Credit

(iii) 1 Practical per week = 2 hours duration per

week

= 1 Credit

Structure of Courses of the Programmes under CBCS:

- **Core Course :** A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.
- **Elective Course:** Generally a course which can be 2. chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/ domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
- Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective courses that may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.
- Generic Elective (GE) Course: An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective.

P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

5. Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)/Competency Improvement Course/Skill Development Courses:

The ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: AE Compulsory Course (AECC) and AE Elective Course (AEEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. They (i) Environmental Science, (ii) English are mandatory for all disciplines. AEEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

6. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication

7. Skill Enhancement Course (SEC):

These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based instruction.

Project Work/Dissertation is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving/analyzing/exploring a real life situation/difficult problem. A Project/Dissertation work would be of 6 credits. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific effective.

1. Processing Service:

3. Circulation Section:

This section is situated in the FIRST FLOOR of the library along with lending section. The KKH Library having a very well equipped circulation desk to provide smooth service towards its user. At present there are four circulation desks for circulation of books. Services offered by Circulation section are as following - Membership registration, Issue/return, Renewal, Issue of Library clearance certificate, NLIST user registration and password delivery, NDLI registration, alert service, e-mail service, bibliographic service etc.

5. Technical Section:

The main activities of this section are as following - Maintenance of Koha ILMS, Maintenance of Library portal, Maintenance of Internet resource center, Maintenance of eresource of the Library etc.

6. Internet Resource Center:

The internet resource center is located at GROUND FLOOR of the library and equipped with 13 nos. of computers

and 2 nos. of Printer (One Laser Printer and one Inkjet Printer). This section is mainly used by the users for accessing e-resources such as e-book, e-journals, database etc.

7. Manuscript Section:

One of the major achievements of K.K.H. Library is its manuscript section situated at ground floor of the library.
